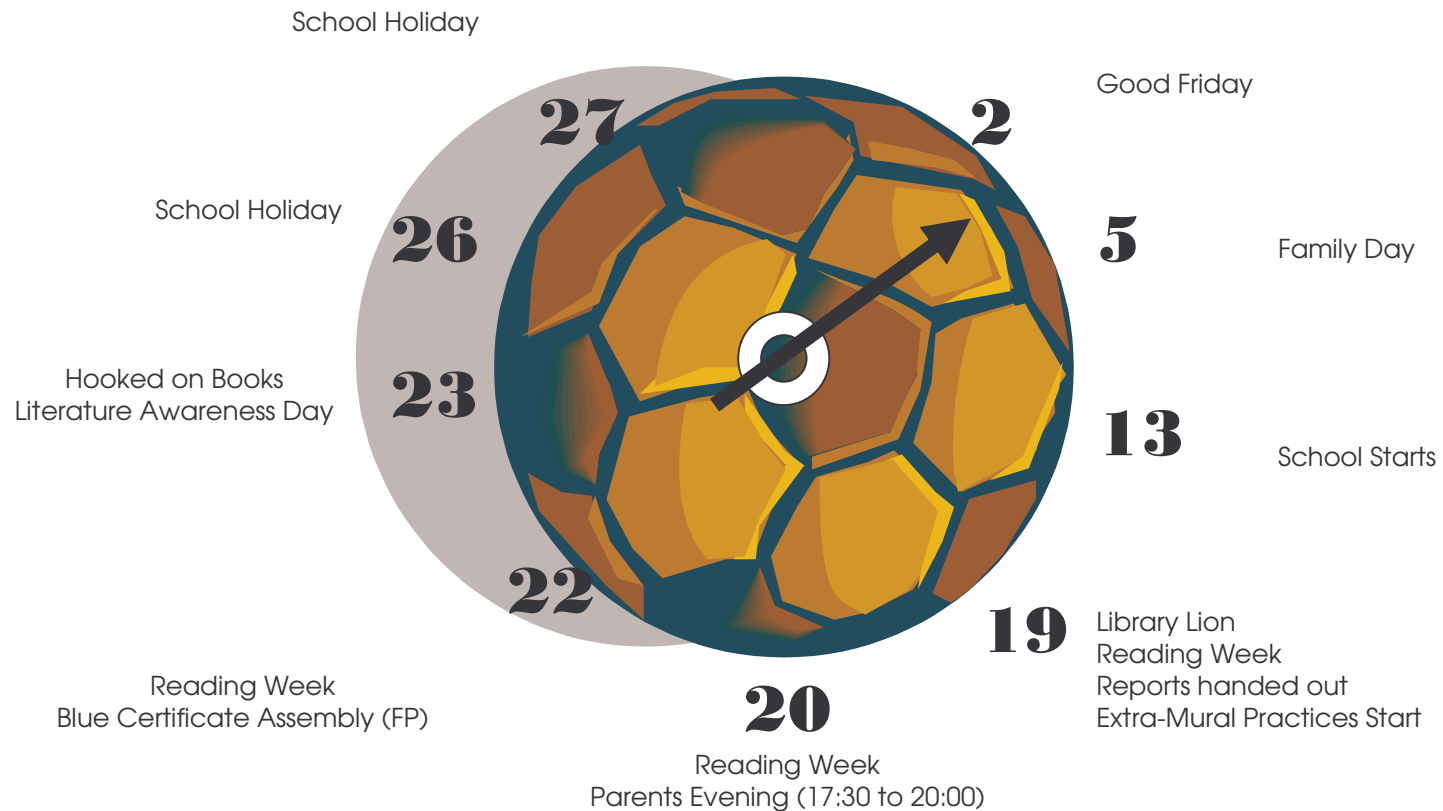
As we go about our day to day activities, let us make every effort to display God's goodness in even the most mundane tasks.

## WAYS TO HELP KIDS LEARN SPELLING WORDS

Once your child enters elementary school, he is going to have to deal with homework. For some [children](#), the most difficult homework is repeated every week in the form of spelling words. While some students find learning spelling words easy, most students need to practice them. In order to help you we will be putting spelling tips in the King's Ken as suggestions that can be used:

### **TIP 6: Colour is COOL**

Write each of your spelling words, but write each letter in a different colour.

or

Write your spelling word and trace it five times using a different colour each time.

or

Write your spelling words using dots. Then connect the dots by tracing over them with a coloured pencil. Use a different colour for each word.
